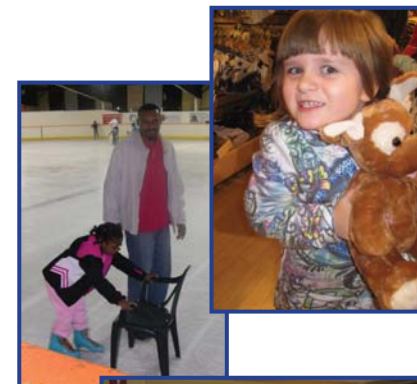


One of our Facebook pages.

I attended Cancer Services' Capital Chefs' Showcase never imagining that within five months my own son would be diagnosed with cancer and I'd become a recipient of their services. Patrick was a year and a half when I took him to the hospital for a fever and swelling. He was diagnosed with neuroblastoma - a cancer that develops in nerve tissue. A few days later we were in a St. Jude's hospital room in Memphis getting his first round of chemo.

Remembering Cancer Services, I went to them and received a grant to help with our mounting expenses. Through Children's Programs I connected with other parents who know what it's like to give your own child injections or watch them suffer through the painful side effects of cancer treatments. Frank Spooner, Client

One of the Lung Cancer Support Group veterans, Frank was first diagnosed with larynx cancer and later with lung cancer. After 21 years of survivorship, his best advice is to "take it one day at a time." Frank's smile and optimism inspire newly diagnosed clients.

How did you first hear about Cancer Services?

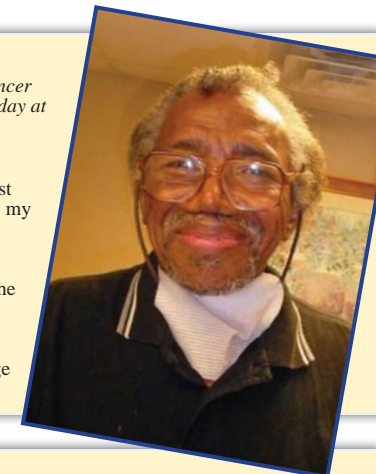
I came to Cancer Services when my doctor suggested nutritional supplements during my first diagnosis. Then I came to the support groups. When I was later diagnosed with lung cancer, my doctors gave me a 20% chance of survival. Six years later, I'm still here attending groups.

What's your favorite thing about Cancer Services?

Support groups are good to get with people who have a similar understanding. Because of the group, we can know what to expect from side effects and medications.

Do you have any advice for other cancer survivors?

I wish more people would participate in what Cancer Services offers. Look at me: even stage 4 inoperable lung cancer isn't a death sentence. You can still live a good life with cancer.



Vivian Sims, Volunteer

"Miss Viv" has been volunteering at Cancer Services since 1994. Her husband, daughter and Miss Viv herself all had cancer, so she can truly empathize with our clients and give advice from her personal experiences.

What made you start volunteering?

I was so thankful for the hospital bed and other supplies my husband and I received from Cancer Services, I started volunteering myself.

What do you enjoy about volunteering at Cancer Services?

I first worked in the library and in distribution where I enjoyed being able to know the clients. Now at the reception desk, I enjoy answering phones since I once worked as a telephone operator. I find volunteering actually helps me more than the person I'm helping.

What's your favorite Cancer Services memory?

In distribution we had some night gowns that had been given to us to share with clients. I remember giving one to a lady who seemed so appreciative to have a pretty gown to wear while she was going through chemo.



Sandra Falcon, Direct Assistance Coordinator

Our longest-serving employee, Sandra is often the first face clients see. With her experience and giving personality, she caters to the special needs of each individual.

How long have you been working at Cancer Services?

Seventeen years and I've had nearly every job! I started working part-time in data entry. When we moved to our current location on Loddell, it felt so huge we were doing cartwheels in the library!

What's your typical day like?

I mainly do intakes to welcome new clients and I also help them with healthcare navigation to find outside resources. When we meet new clients, we're not just taking names and getting information... we connect on a personal level. Sometimes we laugh, sometimes we cry and each client has different needs we can fulfill.

What do you like most about Cancer Services?

This organization is making a difference in our community. It's easy to wake up and come here. I'm always touched by the relationships we develop with our clients.



Reiki

The Japanese practice and its role at Cancer Services



Cancer Services began offering Reiki to our clients a year ago. It started with one volunteer practitioner and a few clients twice a month. Now three Reiki practitioners see 7-9 clients each week.

But what exactly is Reiki? Even Martha Novoa, a Reiki master who sees clients at Cancer Services, has trouble explaining it, citing that “it is a different process and experience for each person.” Reiki (pronounced “raykey”) means “universal life energy.” The word is made of two Japanese words - Rei which means “God’s Wisdom or the Higher Power” and Ki which is “life force energy”. So, Reiki is actually “spiritually guided life force energy.” Though it is spiritual in nature, it not a subscribed part of any religion or dogma.

The practice bases itself on belief that energy is channeled through a Reiki practitioner to help a person through correcting their energy balance. A practitioner places their hands on or directly above the person who may be experiencing pain or in need of relaxation. Clients leave their sessions feeling relaxed, and one Cancer Services client even reported being able to drop her five different pain medications because, with

Reiki, she didn’t need them anymore.

Even after 14 years of practicing Reiki, Novoa still feels a sense of awe when a client describes how, thanks to Reiki, their pain is no longer there. She explains: “Everyone has energy in their bodies and when something good happens your body produces good energy but when something bad happens, your body responds with negative energy. It is my job to get out of its way and simply direct the energy where the person needs it.”

Reiki has been practiced in the US since 1937 and has recently gained popularity. The medical community is still studying its true efficacy, but many of our clients swear by Reiki and its effects. Karen Farris, who was diagnosed with CML leukemia, appreciates how Reiki relaxes both your brain and your body. She shared, “Once Reiki is done, I leave with a sense of confidence that I can respond appropriately to any situation I may encounter.”

Though she admits it can “sound a little voodoo-like,” Karen found that Reiki “helps me relax in a way that I would not at home.” As a cancer survivor, she finds that Reiki can play a special part in her treatment and recovery. “When you get diagnosed you can have a mindset of, ‘get it done’ or it ‘doesn’t matter.’ But Reiki helps me ‘be’ and accept, with hope, where I am in my treatment process.” Karen encourages other cancer survivors to give it a try before dismissing it.

In the United States, Reiki is recognized as part of Complementary and Alternative Medicine (CAM) – defined as a group of diverse medical and health care systems, practices and products that are not generally considered part of conventional medicine. CAM practices are designed to be used in conjunction with conventional treatment and include but are not limited to:

- dietary supplements
- botanicals
- yoga
- massage
- probiotics
- meditation
- acupuncture
- Reiki



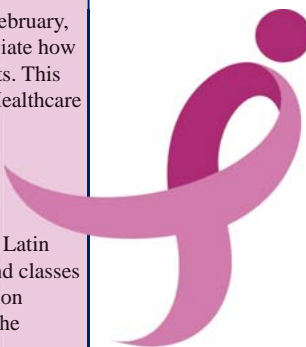
